

# Alberta Population Report

March 29, 2007

Fourth Quarter, 2006

## POPULATION ESTIMATES

Alberta's population growth between January 1 of 2006 and 2007 remains the strongest among the provinces. As of January 1, 2007 Alberta's population was estimated to be 3,435,511. This represents an annual growth of approximately 108,800 persons (or 3.27%) during the year of 2006. British Columbia and Ontario had the next largest growth rates among the provinces at 1.29% and 0.89% respectively.

The following table provides the population estimates and annual growth rates for Canada and Alberta since January 1, 2003.

## MIGRATION

In the fourth quarter of 2006, Alberta continued to have the largest interprovincial migration gain (11,800 persons) among provinces, but the gain was 30% less than the previous fourth quarter. The primary source of Alberta's interprovincial in-migrants for the fourth quarter was Ontario, followed by British Columbia and Saskatchewan (Table 3). These three provinces were also the main destinations of out-migrants from Alberta.

On a yearly basis, Alberta hit a record high level of net interprovincial migration in 2006 with a total gain of 63,300 people. This was the tenth consecutive year that Alberta maintained the highest interprovincial migration gain in Canada.

## NATURAL INCREASE

Between October 1 and December 31 of 2006, Alberta experienced a natural increase (births minus deaths) of approximately 5,200 people. The province had 10,500 births and 5,300 deaths in this quarter.
