First Quarter, 2008

POPULATION ESTIMATES

Between April 1, 2007 and April 1, 2008, Alberta's population increased by 1.82%, the fastest growth among the provinces, but much slower than the previous twelve months. In the first quarter of 2008, Alberta had a small gain in interprovincial migration after two consecutive quarters of net interprovincial outflows. The net inflow of international migrants remained strong in this quarter.

Table 1 provides the population estimates and yearly growth rates for Alberta and Canada. As shown in this table, Alberta's population was estimated to be 3,512,368 on April 1, 2008. This represents a yearly growth of approximately 62,800 persons (or 1.82%) for the year ending April 1, 2008, comparing to a growth of 101,900 people (or 3.04%) for the period ending April 1, 2007. Although Alberta's population growth for the past twelve months was the lowest in four years, it was still 70% higher than the national average of 1.07%.

Table 2 presents the population estimates for April 1, 2008 for all provinces and territories and the growth rates since April 1, 2007. As shown, Saskatchewan and British Columbia had the next fastest growth rates among the provinces at 1.80% and 1.49% respectively.

MIGRATION

During the first quarter of 2008 (January 1 to March 31), Alberta had a rebound in interprovincial migration after two consecutive quarterly losses of interprovincial migrants. The province gained 710 people in interprovincial migration, as compared to a net loss of 880 in the fourth quarter of 2007.

As revealed in Table 3, the continued net inflows of migrants from Ontario (2,200) and Quebec (960) to Alberta more than offset the net outflows of Albertans to British Columbia (1,960) and Saskatchewan (1,050) in the first quarter of 2008. In addition, Alberta's renewed gain of people (170) from Newfoundland, comparing to a loss of 400 in the previous quarter, also contributed to the rebound in this quarter.

Between January 1 and March 31 of 2008, Alberta's international migration remained strong with a net inflow of 4,400 international migrants settling in Alberta.

NATURAL INCREASE

In the first quarter, Alberta had a natural increase (births minus deaths) of approximately 5,400 people. The province experienced 10,900 births and 5,500 deaths between January 1 and March 31 of 2008.

* Estimates of non-permanent residents (NPRs) represent the number of non-permanent residents living in Canada. The five following groups are referred to as NPRs: (1) persons residing in Canada claiming refugee status; (2) persons residing in Canada who hold a study permit; (3) persons residing in Canada who hold a work permit; (4) persons residing in Canada who hold a Minister's permit; (5) all non-Canadian born dependants of persons claiming refugee status, or of persons holding study permits, work permits or Minister's permits and living in Canada.
