

POPULATION ESTIMATES

Alberta's population continued to have the highest year over year growth rate among all provinces, showing an increase from the 2008 first quarter. The first quarter of 2009 showed net inflows of people to Alberta from both interprovincial (7,144) and international (4,175) sources, as well as net non-permanent residents (4,626).

As of April 1, 2009, Alberta's population was estimated to be 3,653,840 (Table 1). This count represents a year over year increase of approximately 96,285 persons (2.71%) since April 1, 2008. Although Alberta's population growth rate has slowed since 2007, it presently remains double the national rate of 1.23%.

Population estimates for April 1, 2009 and growth rates (since April 1, 2008) for all provinces and territories are provided in Table 2. Across all provinces, Alberta had the highest growth rate, year over year, at 2.71%. British Columbia and Saskatchewan had the next highest growth rates of 1.70% and 1.49%, respectively.

MIGRATION

In the first quarter of 2009, Alberta had the largest interprovincial migration gain in Canada (Table 3). The province gained 7,144 people in interprovincial migration. This increase is significant when compared to the net interprovincial migration observed in the first quarter of 2008 (2,761). The interprovincial gain in the first quarter of 2009 was primarily attributed to the net inflow of migrants from Ontario (3,546) and British Columbia (855). Alberta gained in interprovincial migrants from all provinces except from Prince Edward Island (-41) and New Brunswick (-38).

Alberta's international migration remained strong in this quarter with a net inflow of 4,175 international migrants. There were fewer net non-permanent residents (4,626) in the first quarter of 2009 than in previous quarters (see Table 4). These numbers represent a steady net flow of international and non-permanent residents in the province, as they do not substantially deviate from the net flow of migrants in the fourth quarter of 2008.

NATURAL INCREASE

In the first quarter of 2009, Alberta posted a natural increase (births minus deaths) of over 5,412 people. The province experienced 11,212 births and 5,800 deaths in the first quarter of 2009. This natural increase is comparable to the first quarter of 2008 (5,426), however represents a decline in the natural increase population when compared to each of the other 2008 quarters.

* Estimates of non-permanent residents (NPRs) represent the number of non-permanent residents living in Canada. The five following groups are referred to as NPRs: (1) persons residing in Canada claiming refugee status; (2) persons residing in Canada who hold a study permit; (3) persons residing in Canada who hold a work permit; (4) persons residing in Canada who hold a Minister's permit; (5) all non-Canadian born dependants of persons claiming refugee status, or of persons holding study permits, work permits or Minister's permits and living in Canada.
